

The Goal of Enhanced Care Management

 Enhanced care management is a collaborative and interdisciplinary approach to providing intensive and comprehensive care management services that addresses the clinical and non-clinical circumstance of our members with the highest needs.




• The overall goal of the ECM benefit is to provide comprehensive care and achieve better health outcomes for our Members.



Comprehensive Assessment a CORE component of ECM

• After the initial step of successful engagement with an ECM Member, a comprehensive assessment must be conducted.

 The ECM Comprehensive Assessment must assess the Member's physical health, mental health, Substance Use, Community- Based Long Term Services and Supports, oral health, palliative care, social supports and social determinants of Health (SDOH)





Comprehensive Assessment a CORE component of ECM

- Comprehensive Assessment must include DHCS standardized Long Term Services and Supports (LTSS) questions to identify and refer Members who may have LTSS needs.
- The LTSS is a set of ten (10) questions developed by DHCS are to assess risk factors involving ADL's/IADL's, housing environment, low health literacy, caregiver stress, abuse and neglect, cognitive impairment, fall risk, financial insecurity/poverty and isolation.
- The Comprehensive Assessment provides an opportunity to appropriately assess and identify the Member's health status, immediate risks, gaps in care and serves as a tool to formulate an Individualized Care Management Plan.



ECM Comprehensive Assessment

- The ECM team has developed a Comprehensive Assessment Template that is **strongly recommended** for ECM providers to use. (DHCS policy, Sister plans-WPC, PICF, CMO etc.)
- Ensures all domains of the member's life are address as required and outline by DHCS.
- Assist with the Utilization Management process by preventing delays in authorization determinations due to missing required information.
- Reduces gaps in care for members transitioning from ECM to lower level of care or from one ECM provider to another.
- ECM providers can use additional assessments such as PHQ-9 or MMSE to conduct further assessment of a particular need.



Comprehensive Assessment Template



Care Management Plan

- After the completion of the Comprehensive Assessment a comprehensive, individualized, person-centered care plan must be developed.
- The Care Management Plan should be developed with input from the Member and/or their family member(s), guardian, AR, caregiver and/or other authorized support person(s) as appropriate to assess strengths, risks, needs, goals and preferences and make recommendations for service needs.
- Incorporating identified needs from the assessment and strategies to address those needs.
- Ensuring the Care Management Plan is reviewed, maintained, and updated under appropriate clinical oversight.
